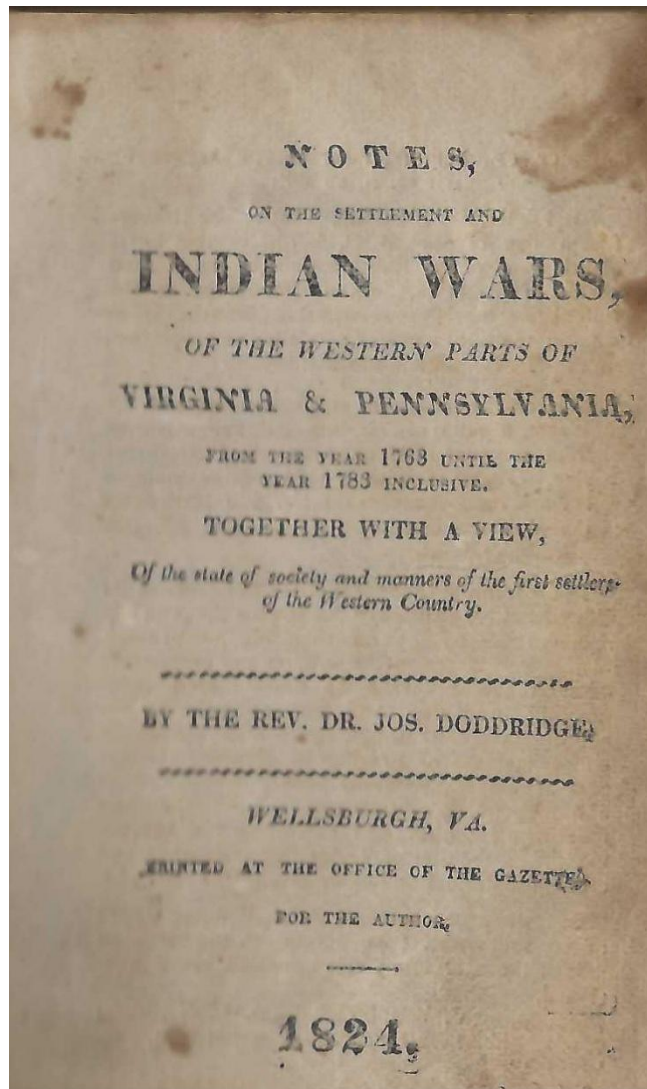
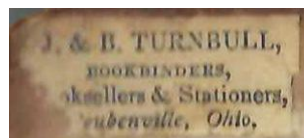

Turnbull. The binding is very likely a product of Turnbull's bindery.
